






1,400 Free and Charitable Clinics and Pharmacies provide access to affordable healthcare for uninsured and underinsured people in communities throughout the United States. In 2021, organizations helped **1.8 million patients** through **6.2 million patient visits**. The number of new patients increased from 527,000 in 2020 to **624,000 new patients** in 2021.



- Compared to 42% of the U.S. population, 65% of patients were members of racial/ethnic minorities
- 52% of patients seen in 2021 were employed
- 85% of patients seen in 2021 were uninsured
 - Of the number of patients that were insured, 70% were noted to be insured but unable to afford care (underinsured)
- Patient age ranges: 0-17: 43%,
 18-64: 99%, 65+: 69%
