



PATIENTS OF FREE & CHARITABLE CLINICS & PHARMACIES 2023

1,400 Free and Charitable Clinics and Pharmacies provide access to affordable healthcare for uninsured and underinsured people in communities throughout the United States.
In 2022, organizations helped 1.7 million patients through 5.8 million patient visits, with 628,000 new patients in 2022 and a 73% increase in patients inquiring about care in the past year.

Areas Patients Reside

- A majority 59% of patients were members of racial/ethnic minorities, compared to 37% of the U.S. population.
- 52% of patients were employed.
- 85% of patients were uninsured.
 - Of the patients that were insured, **50%** were noted to be insured but unable to afford care (**underinsured**).
- Patient age ranges:
 - 96% of clinics serve patients in the age range of 18-64 years old.
 - 70% of clinics serve patients in the age range of 65+ years old.
 - **43%** of clinics serve patients in the age range of **0-17** years old.
- Patient Gender Identity:
 - 56% of patients identify as female, 40% as male, and the remaining 4% include patients that identify as nonbinary, transgender or who chose not to identify.
